All courses are required unless a choice is indicated. A minimum grade of "C" is required in all courses in the major, in ENGL 1101 & 1102, the math requirement, and MCOM 1110 or BUSA 2000. **Only nine (9) hours of education courses may be taken before GACE Program Admission Assessment tests are passed. This includes courses transferred from another institution.**

General Education Requirements for Degree Completion Program — B.A., B.F.A., or B.S. Degree

To enter the Degree Completion Program, Piedmont College must accept a minimum of 60 semester units of college level transfer credit from a regionally accredited college or university or nationally recognized examination credit (CLEP or similar). Students with less than 60 semester hours may appeal to the Dean for the School of Arts and Sciences to enter the Degree Completion Program.
